Athletes - Don't Forget...

- Pro-wrap and tape (if required for athletic therapy)
- All Zone required clothing
- Clothing for ALL weather
- Spending money for souvenirs
- Charging cables for electronics
- Any required medications

Code of Conduct

ALBERTA GAMES CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of Conduct identifies the standard of behavior which is required of all participants (athletes, coaches, managers/chaperones) while traveling to, participating at and returning from the Alberta Games. Any breach of this Code of Conduct may result in immediate or future discipline or sanctions against me by the Alberta Games Discipline Committee and/or my provincial sport organization.

ALL Alberta Games Athletes, Coaches and Managers/Chaperones (Participants) shall:

1. Always represent your Zone team as goodwill ambassadors, with dignity and personal integrity within the spirit of sportsmanship, both in and out of competition. Additionally, make no detrimental statements in public (radio, television, print or electronic media) with respect to the performance of any Alberta Games or Host society personnel and volunteers, technical officials, participants, or any actions or policy decisions of the Alberta Games program.
2. Respect the:
 - Members of your Zone team and the contingent representing your Zone
 - Members of all teams competing from all other Zones
 - Technical officials, judges and/or referee's decisions
 - Facilities and equipment of the provincial sport organization and Games Host society, and
 - Games Host Society volunteers, staff, spectators and local business personnel
3. Abide by rules, policies, conduct and standards set by the provincial sport organization, the Games Host Society, and the Alberta Games - Mission staff.
4. Abide by the Accommodation regulations requiring all athletes, coaches and managers/chaperones to:

- Reside in their assigned Alberta Games Village (Accommodation) the nights of February 13, 14 and 15, 2026; and
 - adhere to the 11:00 pm curfew set for the nights of the Alberta Games.
5. Attend the Opening Ceremonies for the Alberta Games and wear the Alberta Games Zone identification. Zone identification should be worn during medal presentations and throughout the Alberta Games, where appropriate.
 6. Avoid individual or collective behavior deemed to be harassment, bullying, discriminatory, offensive or abusive. Additionally, do not use electronic to make or post inappropriate comments deemed to be harassment, bullying, discriminatory, abusive or offensive. Electronic media includes, but is not limited to, email, instant messaging, text messages, phone messages, digital images and website postings, (including social media such as Facebook, X, Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok and/or blogs).
 7. No Alberta Games athlete shall possess or consume alcohol, marijuana or illegal drug substances (as defined by the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act).
 8. Furthermore, tobacco, marijuana, alcohol or illegal drug substances (as defined by the Controlled Drugs and Substance Act) may not be possessed, nor consumed in any Alberta Games – Athletes' Village, Venue or Vehicle.

ADDITIONALLY, ALL COACHES AND MANAGERS/CHAPERONES SHALL:

9. Act as a positive role model for their athletes.
10. Act in the best interest of the athletes, avoiding all unsafe and unacceptable circumstances. Respect the advice of certified medical personnel if an injured or ill athlete is recommended to be withdrawn from competition.
11. Supervise and be responsible for the conduct of their Zone team (athletes, coaches and managers/chaperones) at all times during the Alberta Games.

Discipline

The Government of Alberta, Multisport Games Unit will work in partnership with the Host Society to ensure that provision is made for a safe and enjoyable experience for all participants in the Alberta Games.

All participants are expected to abide by the Alberta Games Code of Conduct.

All violations of the Code of Conduct will be brought to the attention of the mission staff as per the Alberta Games Discipline Procedures.

The Host Society will work in partnership with the Security Portfolio and local law enforcement to ensure the safety of all participants, and to address matters of unlawfulness.

In Person Registration

All participants, coaches and chaperones are required to attend in-person registration.

What happens during in-person registration?

1. Upon arrival, a Games Ambassador will board the motor coach, greet incoming athletes and provide a brief description of the Registration Centre and process for registering. If traveling by private vehicle, ambassadors will greet you at the Registration Centre Entrance.
2. All accreditation tags will be sorted by sport. Once you arrive at the registration center, please see the volunteers at your specific sport table and pick up your accreditation tag and participant bag. After registering, please proceed back to your parked Motor Coach buses as indicated by signage.
3. Coaches will be responsible for picking up the Zone ID and luggage tags for their team

THIS ACCREDITATION TAG IS VERY IMPORTANT - YOU WILL NEED THIS TO EAT, TO CHECK IN TO YOUR ACCOMMODATION VILLAGE AND COMPETE.

If you lose your tag please come with your coach or chaperone to the reprint station located at the Food Centres.

4. Sport Equipment Instructions:

- Athletes requiring transportation for their equipment (Freestyle skiing, Alpine Skiing, Cross Country Skiing, Biathlon, Ringette & Archery) will take their equipment from their Motor coach bus and transfer to their



corresponding marked transport vehicle before getting back on the bus.

- Female Hockey will proceed to the Cold Lake Energy Centre and unload equipment directly into change rooms before proceeding to their Village for check in. Male Hockey will be able to retrieve their equipment bags and bring them to their assigned dressing room in the Bonnyville & District Centennial Centre prior to boarding the bus.

ALL ATHLETES WILL GET BACK ONTO THEIR ORIGINAL MOTOR COACH BUS TO TRAVEL TO THEIR ACCOMMODATION VILLAGE

5. Arrive and check into your Athlete Village and prepare for the Opening Ceremonies! Internal buses will transport athletes to the food center and then to Opening Ceremonies.

Special Notes: Judo and Wrestling athletes need to weigh in for their competition at on Friday February 13, 2026. Wrestling competitors will weigh in at the Registration Centre and Judo will weigh in at the Food Centre after check in at Villages. Athletes must bring their weigh in attire to the food center for weigh ins and will NOT be returning to Villages before the Opening Ceremonies.



Equipment Storage

Alpine Skiing, Biathlon, Cross Country Skiing, Freestyle Skiing, Ringette and Archery Equipment will be offloaded at Registration center, after athletes have complete their registration and before they get back on the Motor Coach buses. Volunteers will transport this sporting equipment to each designated sport venue. Female Hockey will proceed to the Cold Lake Energy Centre and unload equipment directly into change rooms before proceeding to their Village for check in. All other sports will transport their own sporting equipment to sport venues each day of competition.

Each Sport Venue will have clearly labeled and marked equipment storage/dressings rooms in which sport equipment will be offloaded and stored in during competition hours.

Athlete Village Services

Lounge and Recreation Areas

Each Athlete Village will have a designated lounge for athletes and coaches to relax. Campus gymnasiums will be available until 10:00 pm in most schools. Athletes who wish to use these facilities must do so with a chaperone present. There will be clearly marked areas where food and drink is allowed.

Showers

A full shower schedule is located at the Village Supervisor's desk. Please refer to this for shower locations and availability. Some sports will be required to shower at their sport venue, and some will utilize on site shower facilities at their accommodations. In some specific instances, coaches or athletes may be given instructions on shower schedules. Please ensure to read those instructions clearly at your Village.

Valuables

Athletes are encouraged not to bring valuables to the Games. All valuables brought to the Games are at your own risk.

Lost & Found

Lost & Found areas will be located at each Athlete Village and at the Sport Venue admissions desk. If you find an article, please return it to a member of the Volunteer team or to a Village Supervisor. All lost and found items will be collected by the security team on Monday February 16th and brought to the Food Centers for the final chance to claim. Following the 16th of February, the Games office will hold items for a period of 30 days before donating them to local charities.

Accommodation Rooms

Entrance to the Athlete Villages is only permitted to those with the appropriate village names on their accreditation ID tag

Smoking Policy

As per the Alberta Games Code of Conduct tobacco, marijuana, alcohol or illegal drug substances (as defined by the Controlled Drugs and Substance Act) may not be possessed, nor consumed in any Alberta Games – Athletes' Village, Venue or Vehicle.

We want to celebrate the new friendships, great experiences, and the accomplishments of all athletes during the weekend. Three awards will be handed out during this time:

Minister's Cup

The Minister's Cup is awarded to the Zone showing the greatest improvement from one Alberta Games to the next (since 2024 Alberta Winter Games in Grande Prairie).

Alberta Cup

The Alberta Cup is awarded to the Zone achieving the most medal points for sports in the Games (three points are awarded for each gold medal, two points for each silver medal and one point for each bronze medal).

Spirit of Sport Award

The Alberta Spirit of Sport Award is presented to the Zone which best demonstrates the spirit of fair play, sportsmanship, team spirit and cooperation on and off the field.

Transportation

Internal Transportation

Internal transportation will be available to all registered athletes, coaches, and chaperones throughout the Games weekend.

Transportation loops will be from the Athlete Villages to the Food Centre. Additional loops will run from the Food Centre to Sport Venues. Outdoor sports will have a bus loop run based on sport schedule.

Friday February 13, 2026

Internal Transportation from Athlete Villages to the Food Centre will commence at 3:30 pm.

Transportation will run to the Opening Ceremonies until 6:50pm.

Transportation from the opening ceremonies back to athlete villages will begin at 9:15 pm.

February 14/15, 2026

Buses will start to arrive at the food center for their opening hours. Buses will transport all athletes to their sport venue for opening tournament hours and will run on closed loop services until the end of each competition day.

Times will all be dependent on each individual venue.

Monday February 16, 2024

Accommodations are to be emptied by 10:00 am on Monday morning. Athletes will drop their luggage at Agriplex Food Centre (Cold Lake) and the Games Warehouse (Bonnyville) prior to making their way to the Food Centre for breakfast/brunch. Luggage will be organized by motor coach/zone number.

Motor Coaches are to leave at 2:00pm on departure day.

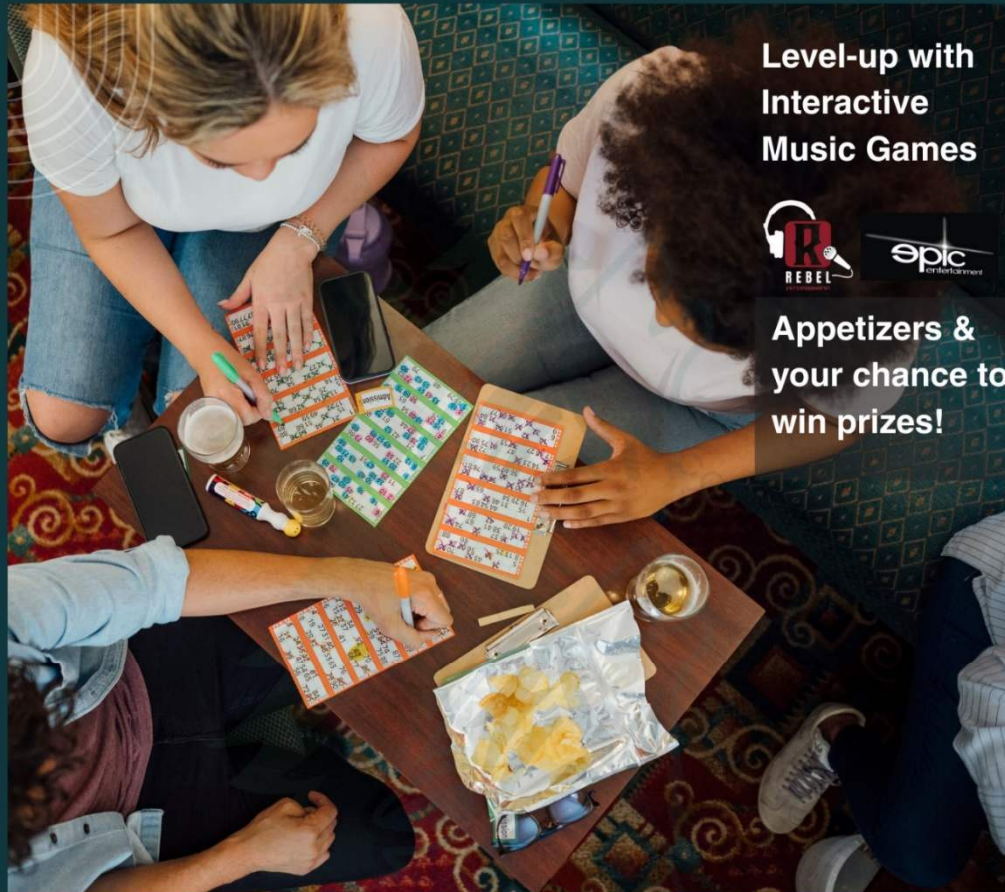

Lost and Found

External Buses - Athlete Arrival - Any items left on buses will be collected and taken to the lost and found at the Food Centres (Cold Lake & Bonnyville).

Internal Buses - If something is left behind at a sporting venue, it will be taken inside the sporting venue and left until the final day of the games; at which point all Lost and Found items will be available for viewing one final time.

Sport Venues – Security or admission desks will store and track all lost and found items throughout the weekend of the games. All unclaimed items will be taken to the Food Centres on Monday February 16, 2026 for one final viewing.

Athlete Villages - There will be Accommodations or Security personnel on 24/7 at the Athletes Villages. All Lost and Found items will be held at each village until the end of the Games Monday February 16, 2026, at which point, items will be transported to the Food Centres for one final viewing.

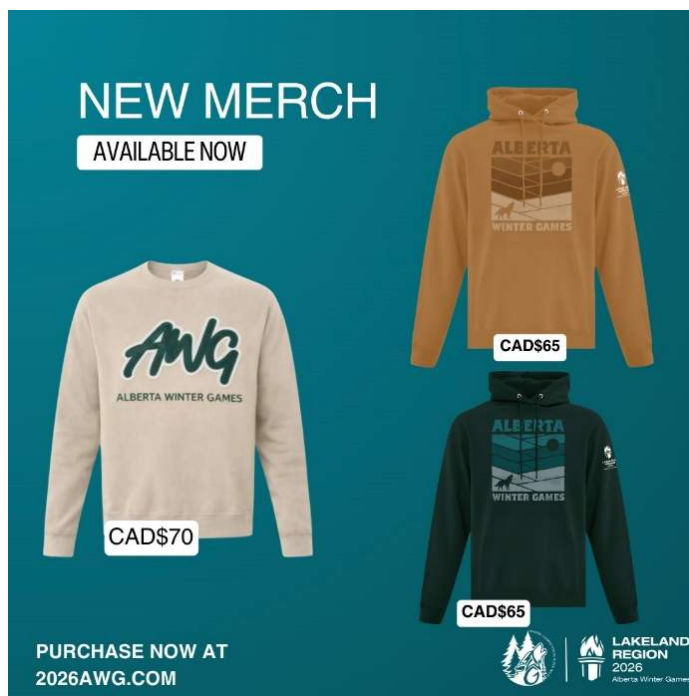
